Kippewa Reflections

This summer was our second year implementing a program at camp called "Kippewa Reflections." We all know that kids grow and learn so much during their time at camp, but they may not recognize this growth on their own. The American Camp Association has started researching the ways that camp experiences have a lasting impact on children. One principle coming through in these early days is that camp-related experiences shortly after the summer enhance the positive effects of camp. It is as if reminding the child of their "camp self" in their home environment activates the positive development they experienced.

With this information in mind, we decided to start Kippewa Reflections last summer. Three times over the course of the session we asked the girls to write, draw, or illustrate in some manner how they were feeling at that moment. We emphasized that this project was individual and personal; no one would be looking it over or grading it as it was purely an opportunity for each camper to express herself in that moment. We explained that we would send the reflections out in the fall as a reminder of their summer experience.

We provided some guidance and writing prompts if they wanted to use them, but we also told the girls they could do whatever they wanted since this was for their own personal use and enjoyment. We received great feedback last year as parents loved seeing what the girls wrote and the girls really enjoyed reminiscing. The reflections were sent home in early-October so hopefully they are now in-hand.

We just hope this project was once again as meaninaful as we believe it should be. We would love to continue to hear feedback from our families about the experience now that some time has gone by after camp and the reflections have gone home.

KIPPEWA LEADERS-IN-TRAINING PROGRAM

This past summer was our first summer incorporating our brand new Leaders in Training program and we are thrilled to say that it was a success! We had 6 awesome LITs participate in a 14 day adventure in Costa Rica plus a 7 day training experience at Kippewa. They were able to not only bond with each other but also with boys of the same age from Camp Cobbossee. The trip incorporated many awesome sightseeing and active adventures around Costa Rica including surfing, zip-lining, hiking a waterfall, visiting hot springs, white water rafting, snorkeling, exploring museums, and touring a coffee farm. The group also participated in community service projects with an organization that provides after-school programs for kids in low income neighborhoods. They painted some of the classrooms and planned out afternoon





activities, leading and playing games with the children. Back at Kippewa, they were able to work alongside counselors in specific programs and in specific bunks and really strengthen their leadership skills and set a great tone for what it means to not only be an LIT at Kippewa but also what it means to be a leader overall. We think this program is a great way to offer opportunities for campers beyond their OC year and

we cannot wait to see this program grow!




