Greetings, Kippewa Families!



Summer is approaching fast and we can't wait to see everyone back in Maine!

The Cobbossee camper experience is centered around three core values: **Brotherhood, Community, and Sportsmanship**.

Brotherhood is experienced each day on the field and court, and often in the tiny moments between the action. Meals, rest hour, evening bunk rituals- these are all times when Cobbossee boys often laugh the hardest, smile the widest, and make the friendships that will have them dreaming of returning to camp for 11 months of the year. **Community** is the sense of membership that everyone in the Cobbossee family is extended. Keeping Our Lake Healthy and Beautiful

One of the most precious natural resources at Kippewa is our lake - Lake Cobbosseecontee. For many of our campers it is a cornerstone of their experience at camp. It provides us with non-stop fun, not to mention the constant breathtaking views! It is important to us to do whatever we can to help keep this amazing resource healthy and clean.

We previously shared information with you about our Beauty Counter account and how excited we are about this ongoing partnership. We set up this account with two goals in mind.

- Commit to using, and promoting usage of, mineral based sunscreen (and other products). We strongly believe in the benefits of using products that are good for the environment and for our bodies as much as possible. And we use a lot of sunscreen at camp!
- Supporting our local watershed foundation Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed. This
 organization promotes and protects the quality of
 our precious lake and the surrounding watershed
 district. They provide programs to educate the
 community (including our campers!) about the
 watershed and promote initiatives to keep our
 water clean.

100% OF ALL PROCEEDS through our Camp Kippewa Beauty Counter account (for any products purchased) ARE DONATED to Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed foundation.

Since we started this partnering spring 2021, our Kippewa community has raised almost \$2500 for the Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed. This past summer we also collected cans and bottles for recycling, and donated those proceeds as well. Between these two programs we are providing meaningful support to help protect our beautiful lake. We hope

you will join in to help us raise even more funds this year!

Be a Part of The Green Team

Spending time outdoors, appreciating nature, and learning to care about our environment are all important and ingrained parts of camp. We make an effort at Kippewa to thread sustainability into our day to day operations. We know this is important to many of our families and staff and wanted to share some of the things we do at camp!

- Several years ago we replaced all of our lightbulbs with LED (energy efficient) bulbs. We have timers on lights in larger communal buildings so they will turn off automatically, and we teach our staff and campers about the importance of turning off lights when leaving a building.
- We use low-flow showerheads to reduce the amount of water that is used.
- As we remodel our bathrooms we are switching to tankless, instant-hot, hot water heaters. They consume much less energy than conventional systems.
- Most of our meals are served on reusable plates & utensils, and when we use paper goods we use compostable plates, napkins, and silverware.
- We have our own compost at camp and when possible partner with local pig farmers - they love our food scraps!
- We are partnering with Ampion community solar, joining a local solar field system to tie camp into, and support, more of a sustainable energy grid.
- Recycling is automatic in the town of Monmouth (where camp is located). We also have separate paper, cardboard, can and bottle recycling at camp.
- We teach our entire camp community about the importance of keeping the environment clean (picking up trash!), and build appreciation for nature into our hiking and nature programs.
- The Green Team is a popular activity where campers can get involved in specific sustainability efforts around camp.

Reduce, reuse, recycle is an overall mindset we try to thread throughout the way that we live our own lives, and the way that we run camp. We know there is always more we can, and will do, and we will also continue involving our campers and staff in whatever way we can.
